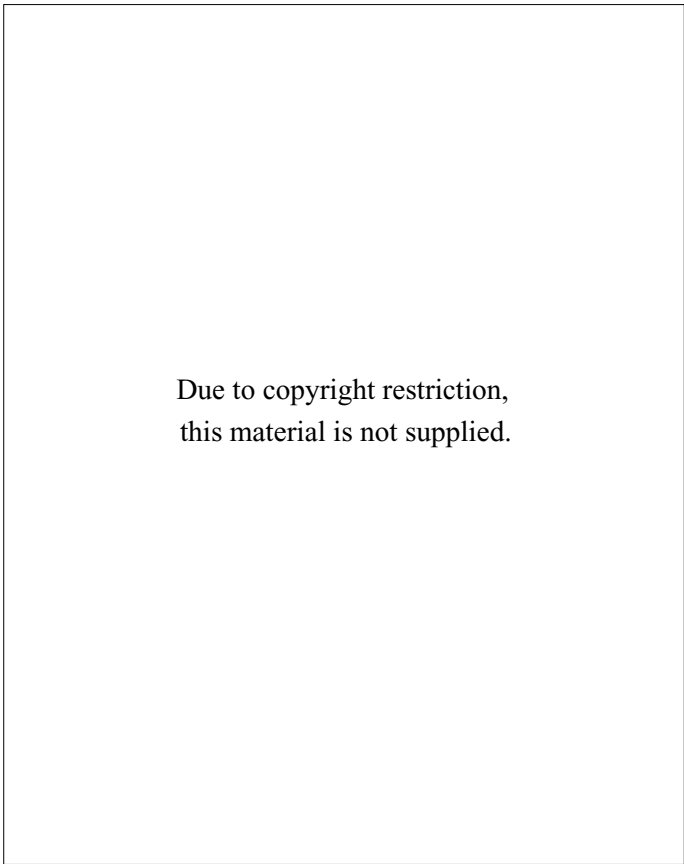


1. David Moore, *Aboriginal Couple, Finnis Springs Mission, South Australia*, 1959, black and white photograph.

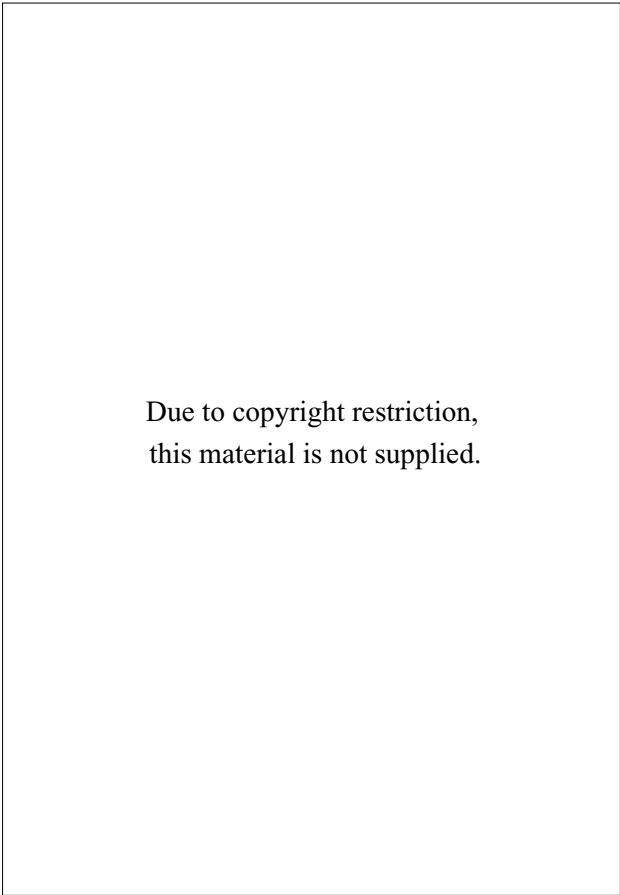

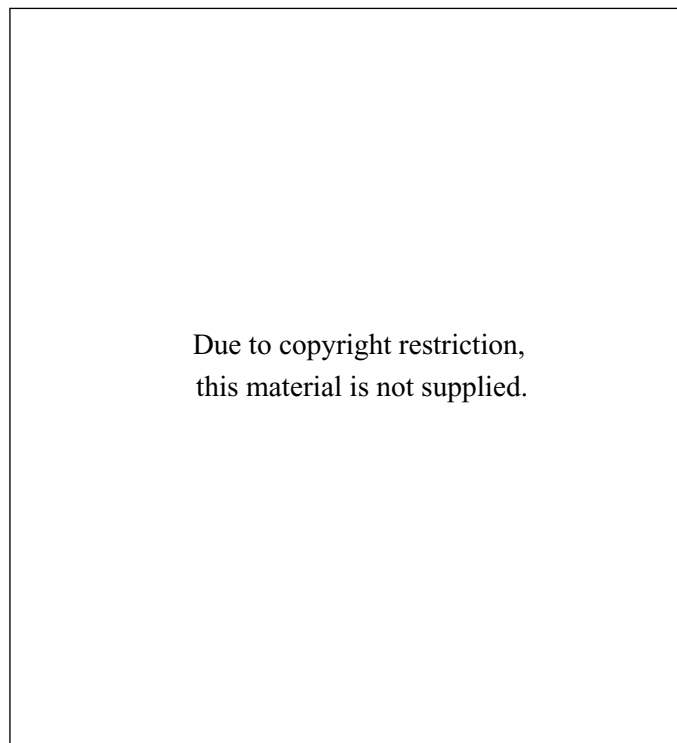
