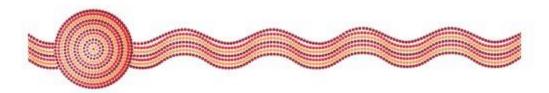




Publication of the Study Design

What will the oral and written exams be like?



External assessment

- The level of achievement for Units 3 and 4 is also assessed by two end-ofyear examinations, which will contribute 50 per cent to the study score.
- Oral examination: approximately 15 minutes
- Written examination: 2 hours plus 15 minutes reading time
