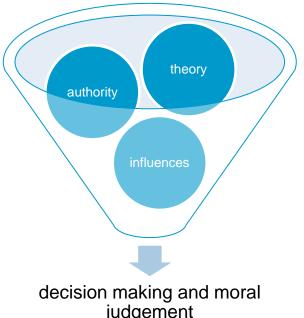
- Retained the core of this unit

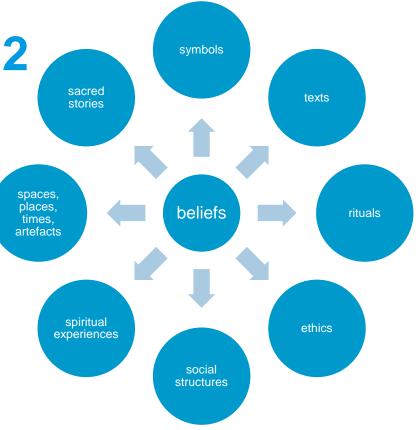
