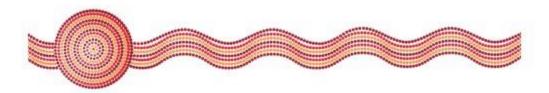

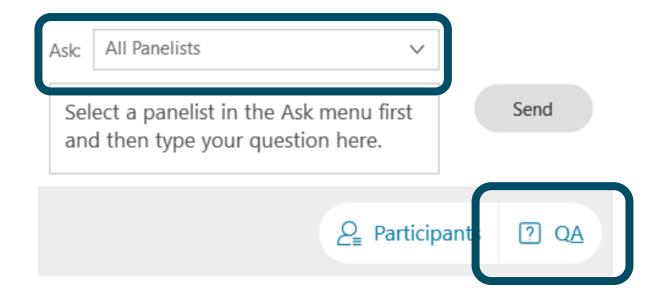

#### What sort of research should be undertaken by students?

There are two types of research- primary and secondary research.

Primary research are surveys, interviews or observations completed by the student. Teachers need to follow the guidance on page 7 of the VCE Sociology Study Design 2024- 2028 in relation to following the TASA ethical guidelines.

Secondary research is where students use data and information published by others.

Examples of short and extended research activities are included in the VCE Sociology teacher support materials on the VCAA VCE Sociology study page.





How will changes in the VCE Sociology Study Design (2024- 2028) result in changes to the structure of the examination?

The structure of the VCE Sociology examination is stipulated in the VCAA VCE Sociology Examination Specifications 2024- 2028 that can be found on the VCAA VCE Sociology study page.



Are the VCAA Performance Descriptors that can be found in the VCE Sociology 2024- 2028 Teacher Support Materials mandatory for teachers to use?

No, the VCAA Performance Descriptors are advice only and teachers are encouraged to design their assessment tools to suit their school context, student cohort and year.



Where can teachers find the definitions of the key concepts?

Generally, definitions are provided in the introduction to each Area of Study throughout the VCE Sociology Study Design 2024- 2028.

Please provide an example of 'the observation of data' might look like in Unit 1 Outcome 1, Key knowledge 'the observation, collection and analysis of data'.

As Sociology is a Social Science it uses scientific method. The step of observation could basically be people watching and recording observations to inform analysis. This could assist in forming a hypothesis to further test.



#### What are examples of representations? Are there any limitations?

Wherever representations are mentioned in the VCE Sociology Study Design 2024-2028, throughout Units1-4, it refers to a broad range such as artwork, sculpture, quotes, speeches, Government policies, newspaper articles, cartoons, books, television shows, movies and YouTube clips.

Please note that this is not an exhaustive list, and not all will be applicable to a topic.

What are the five stages of moral panic required in Unit 2 Area of Study 1, Outcome 1 in the VCE Sociology Study Design 2024- 2028?

The VCE Sociology Study Design 2024- 2028 on page 15 refers to the work of Stanley Cohen, who has outlined five stages of moral panic. This is an example where teacher research is required.



Where do can teachers find Australian data created to crime rates?

Sources of data on Australian crime rates include:

- Australian Bureau of Statistics
- Australian Federal Police
- Victoria Police
- Neighborhood Watch.

The VCE Sociology Teacher Support Materials include activities relating to crime rates, including links to statistics.

What are some examples of sociological concepts in Unit 3 Sociology?

Some examples of sociological concepts in Unit 3 include the following:

- the social imagination
- material and non- material culture
- ethnocentric
- race
- ethnicity.





#### What are some examples of Indigenous responses to historical suppression?

- Response to protection and segregation polices Cummeragunja walk- off 1939, Wave Hill walk- off 1966, Coranderrk Aboriginal Reserve and the escape from a mission story of Mollie Craig, in the "Rabbit- Proof Fence" film
- Response to assimilation policy Freedom rides 1965, rejecting or accepting exemption certificates
- Response to integration policy- Freedom rides 1965, Wave Hill walk- off 1966
- Response to NTER- the Amperlatwaty walk-off 2009





In relation to Unit 3, Area of Study 1, Key knowledge dot point #5 on page 19 do teachers need to explore each of the suppression policies referenced in the introduction to the Area of Study? Would two (in depth) suffice?

This Area of Study requires knowledge of the suppression policies referenced in the introduction to the Area of Study on page 19 of the VCE Sociology Study Design 2024- 2028.

Considering the Key skill dot point #5 on page 20 of the VCE Sociology Study Design 2024- 2028, students are required to analyse the impact of one example of historical suppression on Australian Indigenous cultures. It is a teacher decision as to number and the depth of the examples covered.





# What are some examples of issues relating to the changing awareness of Australian Indigenous cultures?

- January 26th "Australia Day"
- absence of a National Treaty
- racism in sport
- destruction of sacred sites
- renaming sites to reflect local Australian Indigenous names/words –eg City of Moreland to City of Merri-bek
- recovery of First Nations languages eg VCAA VCE Aboriginal Languages Study Design 2023- 2027





Will there be more guidance in terms of options for the case studies in Unit 3 and Unit 4? A list of possible/acceptable options of prompts would be very handy.

When teachers are selecting appropriate case studies it is required that they check against the relevant Key knowledge and Key skills in the VCE Sociology Study Design 2024- 2028.

Is public awareness only linked to representations for building awareness of Australian Indigenous cultures and the relationship between the one issue studied and awareness?

In Unit 3 Area of Study 1, Outcome 1 students are required to analyse representations considering awareness and evaluate how the issue chosen supports and/or limits the public awareness of Australian Indigenous cultures.

Where are the sociological concepts of ethnocentrism and cultural relativism being covered in Unit 3?

As per the VCE Sociology Study Design 2024- 2028 page 19, the sociological concepts of ethnocentrism and cultural relativism are part of the Key knowledge for Unit 3 Area of Study 1, Outcome 1.



Can the specific ethnic group studied be a broad ethnic group in Australia, for example Indian Australians, or does it have to be an ethnic group that is tied to particular location in Australia, for example Indian Australians in Tarneit?


In Unit 3 Area of Study 2, Outcome 2, the specific ethnic group studied does not have to be tied to a specific location in Australia.

What are some examples of specific social movements hat can be used to reference the work of Erica Chenoweth in Unit 4 Area of Study 2 Outcome 2?

Examples that are used to reference the work of Erica Chenoweth are an individual teacher's decision.

In planning their teaching and learning program referencing the work of Erica Chenoweth on the success of social movements, teachers should cover the information referenced in the introduction to Area of Study 2 and address the relevant Key knowledge and Key skills for that Outcome. These can be found on page 25- 26 of the VCE Sociology Study Design 2024- 2028.





When evaluating the influence of social movements on social change, does this evaluation have to reference the work of Erica Chenoweth?

Yes, this is stipulated in the Key knowledge on page 26 of the VCE Sociology Study Design 2024- 2028.
