## Block credit recognition in the VCE

If you choose to do a VET qualification that is not from a VCE VET program, you may be eligible for credit towards your VCE or VCE VM. This is called block credit recognition.

You may receive credit towards your VCE or VCE VM for full or partial completion of a VET certificate.



## Credit towards the VCE or VCE VM

VCE credit received for a non-VCE VET program is decided by the level of the certificate and the nominal hours of training completed. For each VCE unit, 90 nominal hours of training is required at certificate II level or above. A VET certificate at level II can provide credit for Units 1 and 2. A VET certificate at level III or above can provide credit for Units 1 to 4.

You can receive a maximum of six VCE units from a certificate at level II or III. You can receive a maximum of four VCE units from a certificate at level IV and above. You can use the chart below to calcuate the VCE units you will receive based on certificate level and nominal hours of training.

All completed units of competency from a VET qualification will be reported on your VCE or VCE VM statement of results.
