## **Instructions for Section B**

Read the scenario and then answer **all** questions in the spaces provided.

You are a student volunteering in a secondary school breakfast program. You got involved because teachers asked senior students to be part of it. The program has been running for about six months, in a cookery classroom. It runs for an hour before school starts, three days per week. The program began because teachers noticed that some students lacked energy and interest in class. Some students did not bring any food to school for the day. Teachers suspected that many of these young people were undernourished, at least in the morning, and found out that some students were coming to school without having eaten breakfast. Others were skipping breakfast and buying snack food at the local shop instead.

Many of the young people come from diverse social, economic and cultural backgrounds. Most of the students who attend the breakfast program are in Years 7 and 8.

Now that the program has been running for a few months, breakfast is not the only need. Many students have become comfortable enough to start talking about issues at home, from their past, and other problems.

The teachers wish to decrease their involvement and give responsibility for the breakfast program to the volunteers and participants. Before handing the project over, it is decided to review the success of, and need for, the program.

Someone suggests conducting a survey of the young students who are attending in order to find out why they attend the breakfast program.
