Curriculum and the teaching and learning program

The curriculum is:

- defines what it is that students will have the opportunity to learn as a result of their schooling.
- The content of the curriculum includes both knowledge and skills.
- School curriculum is set out in Victorian Curriculum F-10

The school's teaching and learning program is:

 The school-based plan for delivering this common set of knowledge and skills in ways that best utilise local resources, expertise and contexts.





Whole School Planning

Whole-school curriculum planning involves four interrelated layers:

- <u>By School</u> a high-level summary of the coverage of all the curriculum areas, reflecting the school's goals, vision and any particular areas of specialisation or innovation
- By Curriculum Area the sequencing of key knowledge and skills across the years of schooling to support a progression of learning
- By Year Level a coherent program from a student perspective that enables effective connections across curriculum areas
- By Unit / Lessons specifying Victorian Curriculum F–10 content descriptions and achievement standards, activities and resources to ensure students of all achievement levels are able to progress







Whole-school

By School – a high-level summary of the coverage of all the curriculum areas, reflecting the school's goals, vision and any particular areas of specialisation or innovation

There are two parts involved at School level planning:

- Articulating a clear policy direction informing Victorian Curriculum F–10 implementation.
- Documenting a high-level summary of the way the teaching and learning program is structured reflecting the decisions, resources and priorities of the school, such as multi-age classrooms, elective programs, semester length offerings, focusses on literacy and numeracy, integrated teaching units, specialist programs such as religious instructions.

Curriculum Area

By Curriculum Area

By Curriculum Area – the sequencing of key knowledge and skills across the years of schooling to support a progression of learning

Schools are asked to consider the extent to which they have documented the teaching and learning plan for each curriculum area, including the learning areas and capabilities, across the years of schooling to support a progression of learning.

This layer of documentation ensures that student learning is sequential and cumulative, rather than random, which risks either unnecessary repetition or serious gaps in student learning.

The layer of documentation by Curriculum Area includes:

- an overview of overarching concepts/ideas across the years of schooling
- the contexts/topics that will be used for the development of the knowledge and skills
- the sequencing of key knowledge and skills

Year Level

By Year Level

By Year Level – a coherent program from a student perspective that enables effective connections across curriculum areas

Schools are asked to consider the extent to which they have documented the teaching and learning program across the curriculum areas for each year level.

This layer of documentation enables the curriculum to be viewed from a student perspective and for effective and relevant connections to be made across the teaching and learning program.

The Year Level documentation includes:

- time allocations and sequencing of units/topics to enable connections across domains to be identified and built upon
- scheduling of assessment and co-curricular activities.

By Unit / Lessons – specifying Victorian Curriculum F–10 content descriptions and achievement standards, activities and resources to ensure students of all achievement levels are able to progress Schools are asked to consider the extent to which they have documented the daily/weekly teaching and learning program specifying Victorian Curriculum F–10 content descriptions and achievement standards, activities and resources, and assessment tasks to ensure students of all achievement levels are able to progress.

The documentation of Unit / Lessons includes:

- specific content descriptions and achievement standards
- resources and activities to develop knowledge and skills for all students, recognising the time allocation assessment to monitor and progress learning.

Example of template for whole-school curriculum planning – Year 7 and 8


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
Example of template for whole-school curriculum planning template – Year 7 and 8




